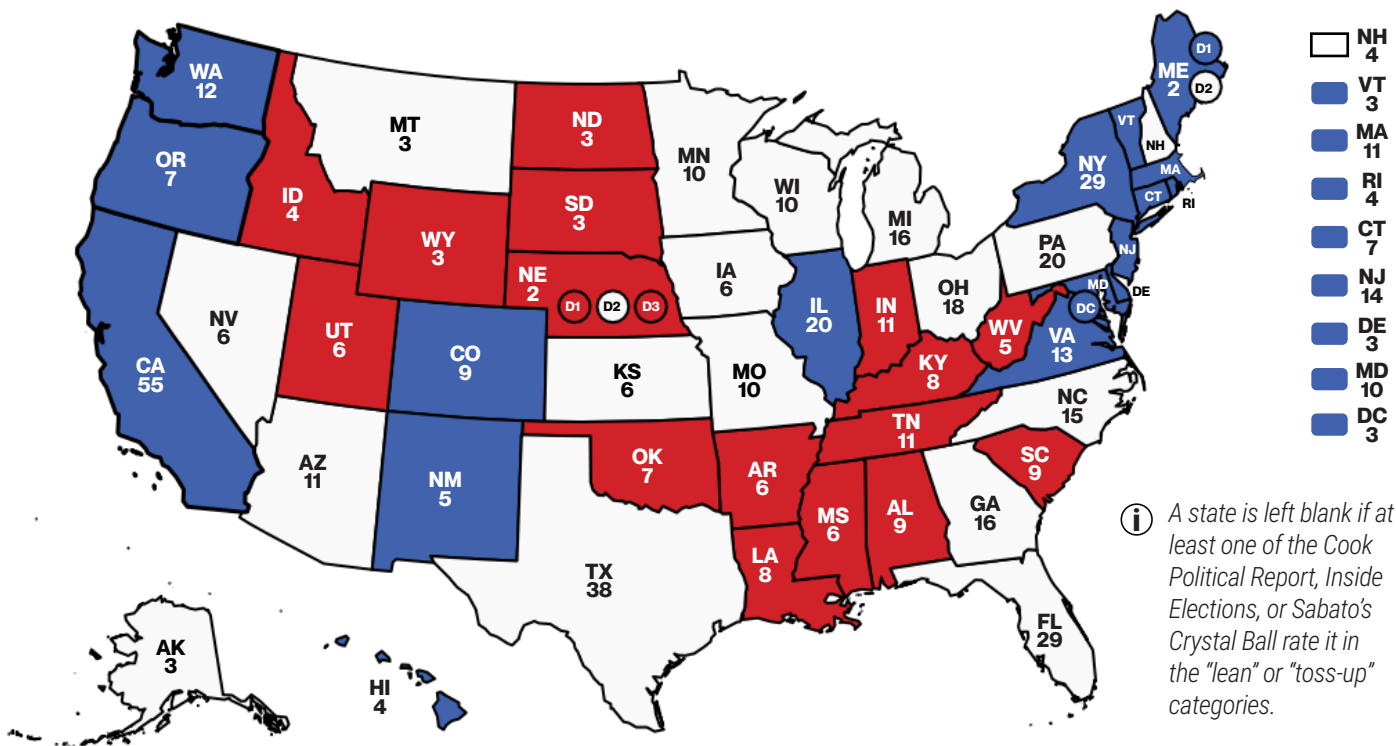

Who won the popular vote?

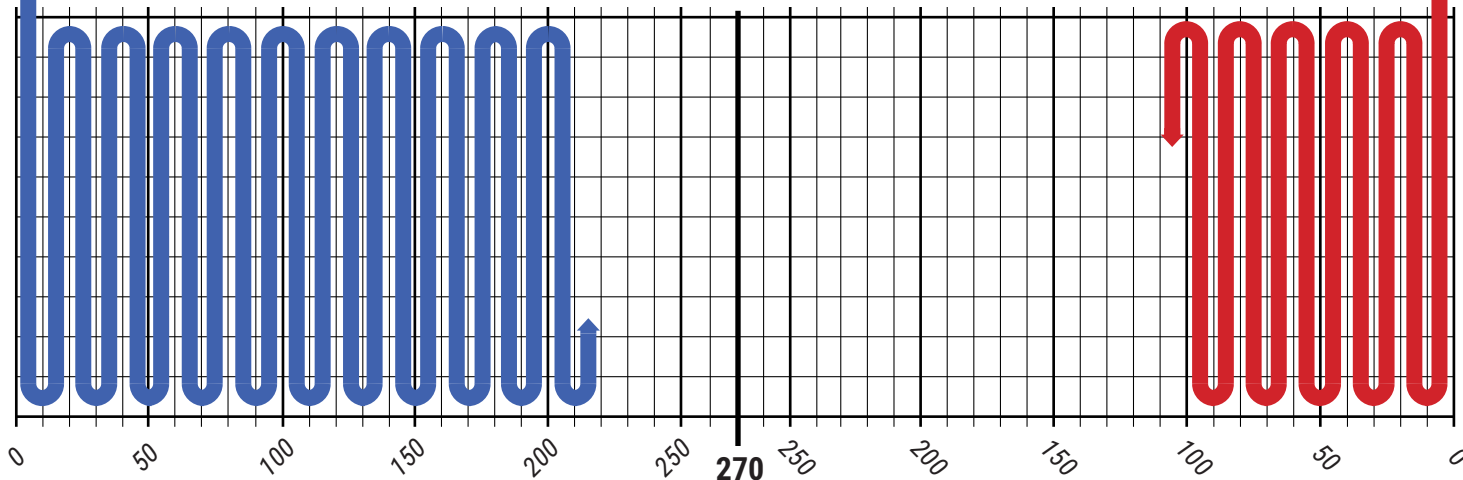
