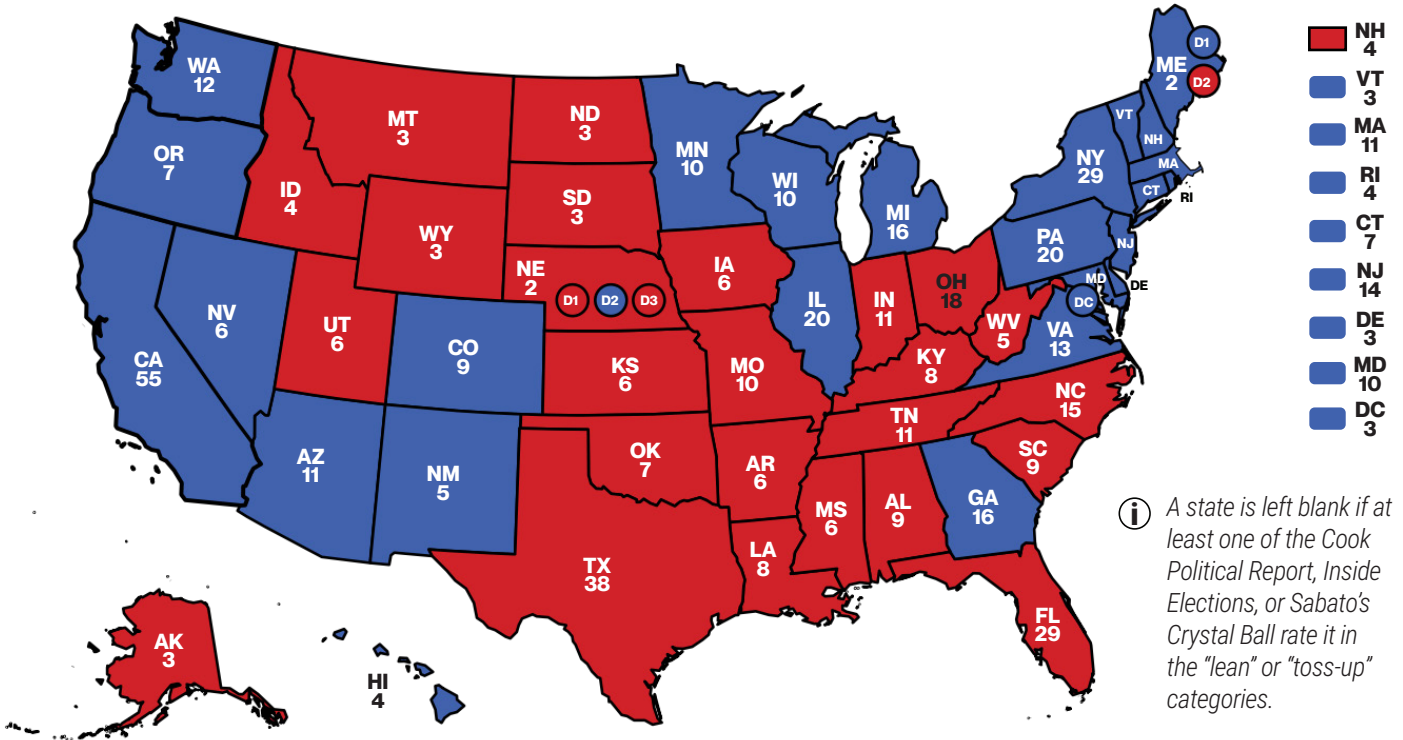

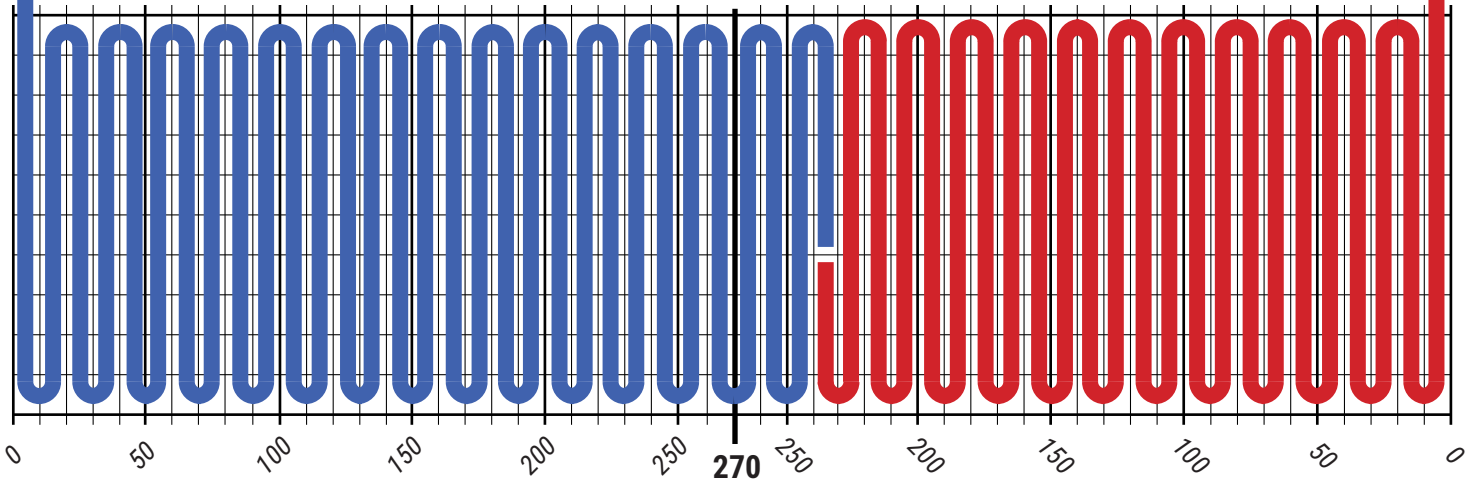

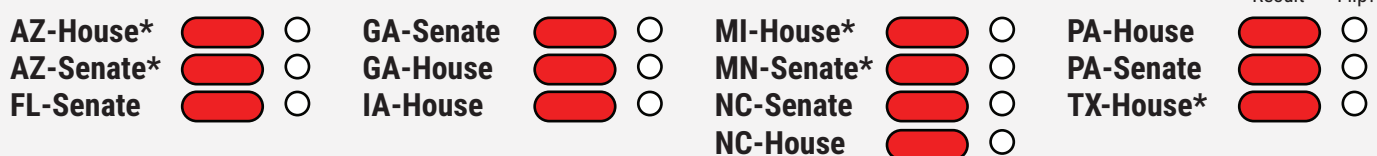

Can GOP gain or keep supermajority?



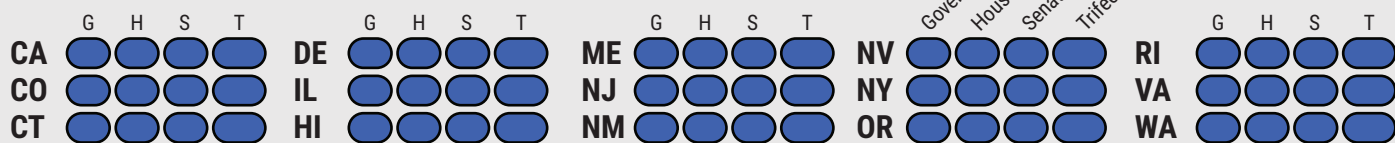

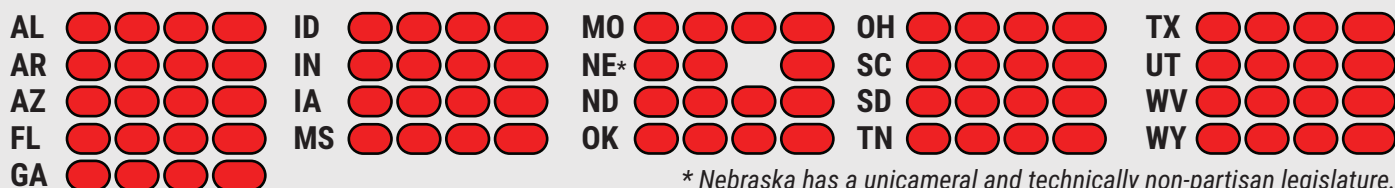
Trifectas: Will a party control a state's government?

Currently a Democratic trifecta (15 states)

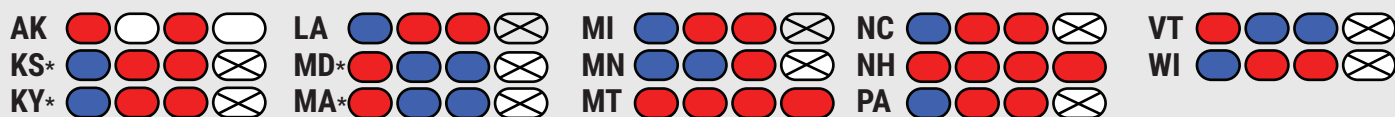


Currently a Republican trifecta (21 states)

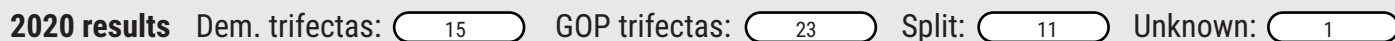

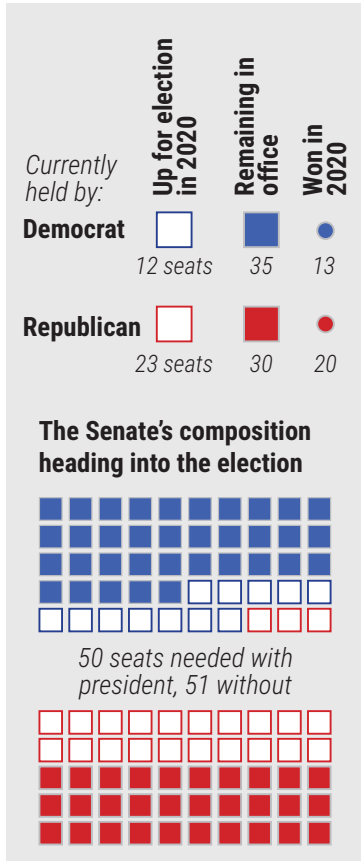
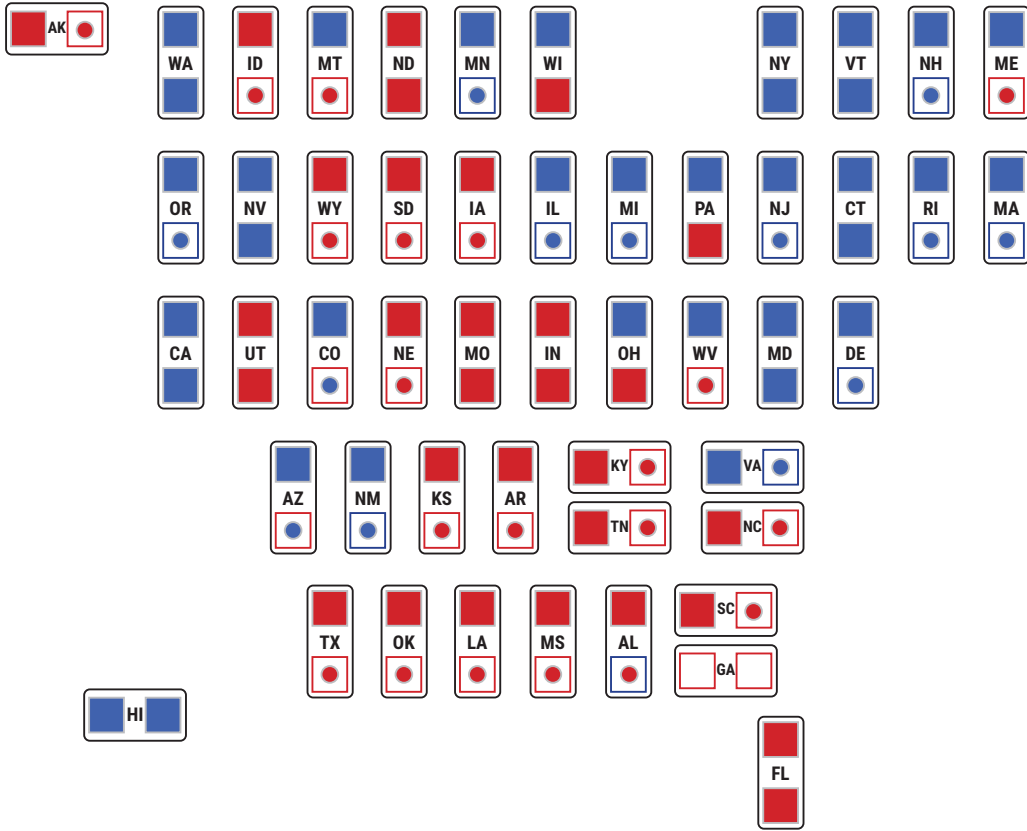
